

Metzora Answers

1. To go to the priest and make the offering that was commanded in the Torah
2. Vayikra 14:2-4 states that the priest was to inspect the leper outside of the camp
3. If it was determined the leper had been healed, one of the two birds was slaughtered in an earthen vessel that was over running water. The living bird, the scarlet, the cedar, and the hyssop were then dipped into the blood mingled with water in the earthen vessel. The priest then shook the living bird, the scarlet, the cedar, and the hyssop over the healed leper seven times. After the sprinkling the priest pronounced the leper clean and released the living bird into an open field.
4. The healed leper totally renewed himself by shaving off all hair, washing his or her clothes, and offering a female lamb mingled with flour and oil.
5. The leper was born anew and became part of the house of Yisrael.
6. The priest and the healed leper standing before the throne of HaShem. The leper's guilt being covered by the offering, the blood and the oil.
